## 1. Executive Summary:

Major outcomes, results and impact of the Chair, including on national policies, in relation to its objectives as stated in Article 2 of the Chair Agreement (between the Institution and UNESCO) (Not exceeding 300 words)

This academic year, the focus in Israel has been the formalising of the Research and Innovation Authority in the Academy and laying foundations for inter-disciplinary applied research. Two main EU programmes continue, DESURBS and COST while a new TEMPUS project supporting student empowerment has begun. The DESURBS has impacted the UNISDR encouraging the integration of culture in the resilient cities programme. At the national level, the COST action on Crime Prevention through Environmental Design has been adopted by the Ministry of Homeland Security and the Chair is currently preparing criteria for the Israel Lands Authority that highlights heritage values and will, hopefully be adopted in the coming year.

The UNESCO Chair continues with intensive international activities, as UNESCO Chargé de Mission and promoting the fields of research at international conferences and workshops. This has included advising on the Tentative Lists of Germany and Canada and preparations for the celebration of the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Nara Document.

As Chargé de Mission to the UNESCO ADG Culture and the Director of the World Heritage Centre, the Chair has represented UNESCO at various venues, participated in numerous activities, and prepared the evaluation of the WHITR-AP C2C in China. The Chair also accompanies the UNESCO Recommendation on Historic Urban Landscape, participating in the HUL +2 years' evaluation at UNESCO HQ and meetings on its application in Edirne, Zanzibar and Hong Kong. As an active member in ICOMOS, the Chair participated in meetings of the International Scientific Committees on Cultural Tourism and Legislation.

These gatherings have played an important role in bringing together prominent British and Israeli academics and leaders in industry, science and the media.

Further to the EU research project DESURBS, the Chair was also appointed Advocate of the Resilient Cities Campaign of the UNISDR.

The Chair is preparing criteria for the Israel Lands Authority that highlights heritage values to be applied to all properties of the Authority.

The situation is similar to previous reporting years.

The financial contribution to the UNESCO Chair from the Bezalel Academy includes a component part of the salary of the UNESCO Chairholder and support for research assistants on a project-by-project basis. With the establishment of the new Research & Innovation Authority in the Academy further resources have been made available during the academic year. Specific activities are supported in kind and with funds for expenses.

All office administration and space is allocated within the budget of the Research & Innovation Authority and the Graduate Programme for Urban Design.

The EU funded projects, and which the Chair is associated, are integrated within the Department Research grants; as were the support given by other agencies. While it is difficult to calculate the exact amounts within the UNESCO Chair activities the rounded amounts are indicated under *Other Public Institution/Body (incl. Research Councils)* and represent the value of the input of the UNESCO chair within these activities.
